Expenditure

1. Boldon Cluster fee including 8 competitions **(£600)**

2. South Tyneside School Sport Level Agreement (3 years entry) which incorporates:
 - Staff CPD including 4 Developing High Quality P.E Courses and 4 Sport Specific Courses for teaching staff
 - Primary Playground Leaders Course for Lunchtime Staff
 - 2 Twilight sessions tailored to our school
 - 12 hours coaching to use in school
 - 40% discount on additional coaching to use in extra-curricular or curriculum time
 - Over 20 competitions across KS2 to compete in.
 - 3 Flagship sport festivals (gymnastics, dance and cheerleading) and 3 mass participation events for full year groups.
 - Outdoor adventure festivals for two year groups.
 - Beach Day competitions for a year group**(FREE due to £5995 previous payment in 2021/2022)**

3. Specialist delivery from outstanding providers in tennis and dance throughout KS2 **(£1080)**

4. Two PE Apprentices to lead our active playtimes and improve our sporting provision across the whole school day **(£17,197)**

4. Sports equipment to further enhance our PE provision and sporting opportunities including basketballs, bibs, footballs and marker sets **(£325)**

5. Transport to sporting competitions **(£380)**

6. Trophies and stickers to acknowledge outstanding achievement **(£410)**

8. Year 6 Football League and Cup **(£85)**

Total Expenditure this academic year up to April 2023 = £20,077
