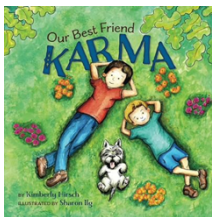
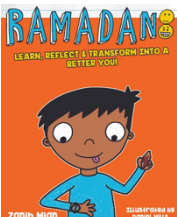

In this unit, we will learn about right and wrong and why actions matter. We will explore Christian beliefs about forgiveness through the Bible and how Jesus taught people to forgive. We will compare Christian and Humanist ideas about saying sorry, learn how Jewish practices link to beliefs about God's judgement, understand that many Muslims believe God judges actions and intentions, and explore why some Hindus try to live morally and make good choices. • Identify what actions might be seen as wrong and why. • Identify what Christians believe about forgiveness from Bible stories. • Describe how Jesus teaches forgiveness through his actions and words. • Make simple links between Christian beliefs and actions such as prayer, repentance, and forgiving others. • Describe similarities and differences between Christian and Humanist ideas about forgiveness and saying sorry. • Make simple links between beliefs about God's judgement and Jewish practices such as prayer, fasting, or giving Tzedakah. • Recognise that many Muslims believe God judges people by both their actions and their intentions. • Explain why some Hindus choose to live morally and make good choices.		Many Christians believe that sin breaks with the relationship of God. Through repentance and prayer God forgives and gives people a fresh start. Many Jewish people believe that God judges how they live. Yom Kippur is a special time to repent, pray and reflect to seek forgiveness. And peace with others. Many Muslims believe Allah shows mercy (forgiveness and kindness) to those who repent. During Ramadan, they fast, pray and try to act with no good intentions Many Hindus believe in karma, that actions have consequences, so good choices bring positive outcomes. Humanists think about the impact of their actions on others and try to make things right when they do wrong.
